For each program, some courses are compulsory, but with over 100 elective course options, you have the flexibility to pursue other areas of interest.

Minor

A minor is available in many subject areas. It provides you with the opportunity to enhance your learning and build out your knowledge. A minor typically requires the completion of six courses in a specific area.

Double Major or Combined Major

Passionate about two areas of study? Combine two areas of study from the Arts, Languages, Social Sciences, or Science within a single four-year Honours Bachelor of Arts or Science degree. In four years, you'll be required to successfully complete 40 courses and gain competencies in two unique programs.

Honours & General Degrees

Honours degrees are usually completed in four years if you take five courses per semester. While a general degree can typically be completed in three years taking a full-time load of five courses per semester. If you wish to pursue a Master's degree, an honours degree is required. If you are looking to pursue professional programs such as education, law, medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, or optometry school, you will need to have either a 3 or 4 year general degree, or a 4-year honours degree (depending on the program), or the required professional program prerequisite courses.

Degree Completion

Upgrade your college diploma with a degree or add a new expertise with a second degree. The number of courses required depends on your previous post-secondary program and degree you wish to pursue.



Automatic Open Entrance Scholarships

No matter what program you choose, you will be guaranteed a minimum level of institutional financial support in the form of scholarships and/or bursaries. Support is granted if you are entering directly from full-time secondary school studies, based on your application for admission and best six final and interim Grade 12 U/M level courses (or equivalent) available in May.

President's Level Support

\$4,000/year 95% to 100% grade range renewable over 4 years

Dean's Level Support

\$2,500/year 90% to 94.99% grade range renewable over 4 years

Blue & Gold Level Support

\$1,000 first year only 85% to 89.99% grade range for first year only

Entrance Scholarships by Application



Our entrance awards recognize a combination of academic excellence, financial need, and good citizenship. Most awards are open to Canadian Citizens/Permanent Residents/Protected Persons as well as international students. Complete your UWinAward Entrance Application Profile (available at the beginning of January) by April 30 to be considered. Submissions received prior to April 30 may receive early consideration. It's possible the values associated with our application-based scholarships and bursaries will afford a student financial support that exceeds the minimum quaranteed level of financial support in Year 1.

Outstanding Scholars Program

Approximately 100 high-achieving first-year students are offered status as Outstanding Scholar Candidates. In first year, candidates receive \$750 per semester in addition to their entrance awards. Candidates meet regularly with program advisors for mentoring. Outstanding Scholars are paid to do research in Years 2-4. Students in all honours majors are eligible. uwindsor.ca/outstandingscholars

Athletic Scholarships

Government-Sponsored Student Loans And Grants

The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) is a financial aid program that can make it easier for students and families to go to university. The program offers support for school through two kinds of funding:

- Grants: money you don't have to pay back (conditions apply).
- >>> Student loan: money you need to repay after graduation.

Funding is available for both full- and part-time postsecondary students, and is based on a number of factors, including your family income. Some students may get their tuition fully covered by OSAP. For the loan portion, there are also programs to help you repay your student loan once you're done school. Both the Ontario and Canadian governments provide this money.

STEP 2: Use your pin typically provided by your school's guidance team in early to mid-fall for your application. Your grades will automatically be forwarded to us from your school via the OUAC.

STEP 1: Apply through the **Ontario Universities**' Application Centre (OUAC) website using the 105 application form by July 1, 2022 (or March 1, 2022 for Nursing) for registration in the Fall term. www.ouac.on.ca/apply/windsorugrad/intl/en_CA/user/login



STEP 2: Please submit a transcript or grade report from your secondary school for the purpose of assessment through the OUAC or as requested through your **UWinsite** Student account. Evaluation and offers may be made on early or unofficial transcripts, but a final official transcript is required to confirm your admission.

Applications should be submitted before July 1, 2022 for registration in the Fall term to ensure sufficient time

for the admission and student visa processing times.



STEP 2: Please submit a transcript or grade report from your secondary school for the purpose of assessment through your **UWinsite** Student account. Evaluation and offers may be made on early or unofficial transcripts, but a final official transcript is required to confirm your admission.

I am interested in studying part-time

If you are interested in taking one to three (1-3) courses at a time or if you are a visiting non-degree student who is applying to UWindsor on a Letter of Permission please follow these steps.

STEP 1: Apply through the UWindsor part-time application through the OUAC. **uwindsor.ca/applynow**



STEP 2: Please submit transcripts from all high school and post-secondary experiences through your **UWinsite** Student account. If applying on a Letter of Permission, please submit the LOP with your transcripts through your UWinsite Student Account.

Part-time student applications are accepted throughout the year with admission to the nearest appropriate term based on program.

I am a mature student

If you possess a high school diploma and are a Canadian citizen or Permanent Resident who has not attended high school in the last two years, and will be over the age of 20 at the start of your program, use this method.

STEP 1: Apply through the **Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)** website using the 105 application form. **ouac.on.ca/ouac-105**



STEP 2: Please submit transcripts from all high school or post-secondary experiences through your **UWinsite** Student account. You will be prompted for a "Letter of Application" after you apply. All Mature Student Applications are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Mature student applications are accepted throughout the year with admission to the nearest appropriate term based on the program. **uwindsor.ca/applynow**

I am a transfer student (College, University)

STEP 1: If you have previously attended a post-secondary institution (university, college, or equivalent), apply through the **Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)** website using the 105 application form. It is recommended to apply by May 1, 2022 for registration to the Fall term to ensure sufficient evaluation time of transfer credits. **uwindsor.ca/applynow**



STEP 2: Please submit transcripts from all postsecondary education through your **UWinsite** Student account. Some students will also be prompted through their **UWinsite** Student account to submit secondary school transcripts. **future.uwindsor.ca/transfer**

Transfer Credits

University Students

Courses will likely be granted transfer credit where there is a grade of 60% or better.

College Students

Non-University Post Secondary courses may be granted transfer credit where a grade of 70% or better is achieved, depending on individual course evaluations. Many block transfer and degree completion pathways are available to incoming college students.

Transfer Credit for International Baccalaureate (IB) Credentials

Applicants with IB credentials may receive transfer credit for approved courses, where they have achieved IB grades of '5' or more, to a maximum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours).

Completion of the IB diploma is not a prerequisite for receiving transfer credit.

Transfer Credit for Advanced Placement (AP Credentials

Applicants with AP credentials may receive transfer credit for approved courses where they have achieved AP grades of '4' or '5', to a maximum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours).

English Language Proficiency

Applicants whose native language is not English must demonstrate proficiency in English to be considered for admission. Here are a few ways it can be demonstrated:

- >> A minimum score of 6.5 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic Test; or
- A minimum score of 83 with a writing score of 20 on the Internet-based Test (IBT) of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); or
- Completed all secondary or post-secondary education in English speaking countries such as the United Kingdom, West Indies and other countries as specified by the Senate Policy; or
- Completed three years of full-time secondary or postsecondary study in a school where the language of instruction is English (e.g., in a British, Canadian, American or Australian Curriculum or an international diploma like the International Baccalaureate) and can demonstrate English proficiency. In some cases, an English proficiency test may still be required; or
- Successful completion of the University of Windsor's English Language Improvement Program (ELIP) (level III) with a minimum final grade of 75%.






