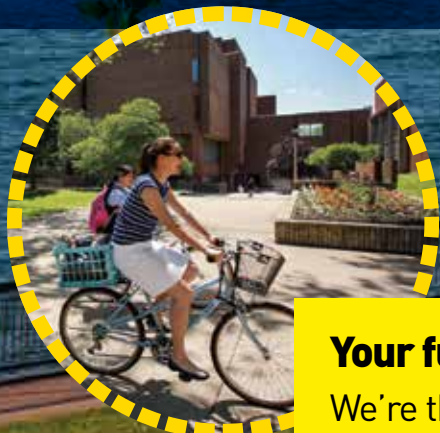

NURSING BScN

The Faculty of Nursing is a premier, innovative centre for nursing education with a focus on hands-on learning and academic excellence. Our faculty and staff provide outstanding, award-winning instruction and involve students in professional development activities stemming from current research initiatives and best practices in nursing. To reinforce student learning in both the classroom and in clinical settings, we have a series of seven experiential learning labs taught throughout the program. These labs are specifically designed to help the learner apply theory to clinical practice through a variety of interactive and simulated activities. In addition, we have simulation labs with high-fidelity mannequins that simulate a variety of human functions, such as breathing and pulses, whose condition can be manipulated throughout the scenario to react in real-time to student intervention. Graduates perform with excellence on the NCLEX licensure examination and are qualified to practise in Canada, the United States, and many other countries around the globe.

for Lambton College Practical Nursing Diploma

Qualified students will be given one year of credit for their previously completed two-year diploma in Practical Nursing that includes all relevant clinical experiences. Each student who enters the program will complete accredited courses from years one and two of the BScN program on the Lambton College site. The courses that have been selected bridge the gap between what was previously studied and what needs to be completed to enter year three at the University of Windsor to complete the BScN.

Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences

Our academic advisors are available to advise you on the transition to university whether you're transferring from college, or another university. Our Reach Student mentors are here to help you gain a deeper understanding of your material or learn critical thinking and communication skills.

Business

The Odette Student Success Centre at the Odette School of Business offers students academic counselling, career advice, tutoring and transition support. Academic advisors will assist you with course selection to ensure you are taking courses that meet your goals and interests. We connect transfer students with a mentor who has had a similar transition.

Engineering

As a transfer student, you will meet with our faculty advisors to understand your academic career path. We offer academic counselling embedded in our programs and assist with developing professional communication skills.

Human Kinetics

All transfer students can connect with the undergraduate coordinator. Your earlier schooling will be evaluated to decide the best academic plan for you and your expectations of the program. Group advising is offered for peers coming from similar educational backgrounds.

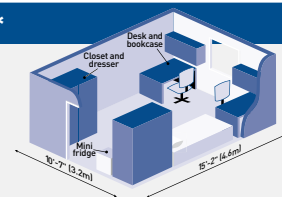

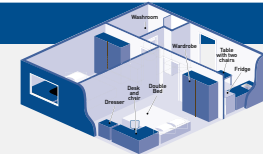

Application Procedures

I am a transfer student (College or University)

Step 1: Apply through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) website using the 105 application form. It is suggested to apply by mid-May for registration to the Fall term to ensure sufficient evaluation time of transfer credits.

UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

Degree courses will be granted transfer credit where there is a grade of 60% (C-) or better.

COLLEGE STUDENTS

College courses may be granted transfer credit where a grade of 70% or better is achieved, depending on individual course evaluations.

TRANSFER CREDIT FOR INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) CREDENTIALS

Applicants with IB credentials may receive transfer credit for higher level (HL) courses, where they have achieved IB grades of '5' or more, to a maximum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours).

Completion of the IB diploma is not a prerequisite for receiving transfer credit.

TRANSFER CREDIT FOR ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) CREDENTIALS

Applicants with AP credentials may receive transfer credit for approved courses where they have achieved AP grades of '4' or '5', to a maximum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours).

If not attending school, a resume or description of your work history may be requested. Those who do not meet academic requirements may be eligible for admission, please visit our website for information.

Mature student applications are accepted throughout the year with admission to the nearest appropriate term based on program. uwin.life/apply

English Language Proficiency

Applicants whose native language is not English must demonstrate proficiency in English to be considered for admission.

Here are a few ways it can be demonstrated:

- A minimum score of 6.5 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS); or
- A minimum score of 83 with an essay score of 20 on the Internet-based Test (IBT) of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); or
- Completed all secondary or post-secondary education in English speaking countries such as the United Kingdom, West Indies and other countries as specified by the Office of the Registrar; or

- Completed three years of full-time secondary or post-secondary study in a school where the language of instruction is English (e.g., in a British, Canadian, American or Australian Curriculum or an international diploma like the International Baccalaureate) and can demonstrate English proficiency. In some cases, an English proficiency test may still be required; or

- Successful completion of the University of Windsor's English Language Improvement Program (ELIP) (level III) with a minimum final grade of 75%.

Guaranteed Financial Support

No matter what program you choose, you will be guaranteed a minimum level of institutional financial support in the form of scholarships and/or bursaries as a qualifying transfer student.

\$500 Scholarship

Full-time undergraduate students who are direct transfers from a Canadian or International college or university (excluding Law and Education) with a transfer average between 80% - 84.9%.*

\$1000 Scholarship

Full-time undergraduate students who are direct transfers from a Canadian or International college or university (excluding Law and Education) with a transfer average of 85% or greater will receive an award valued at \$1000.*

Government-Sponsored Student Loans And Grants

The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) is a financial aid program that can make it easier for students and families to go to university. The program offers support for school through two kinds of funding:

- **Grants:** money you don't have to pay back (conditions apply)
- **Student loan:** money you need to repay after graduation.

Funding is available for both full- and part-time postsecondary students, and is based on a number of factors, including your family income. Some students may get their tuition fully covered by OSAP. For the loan portion, there are also programs to help you repay your student loan once you're done school. Both the Ontario and Canadian governments provide this money.
