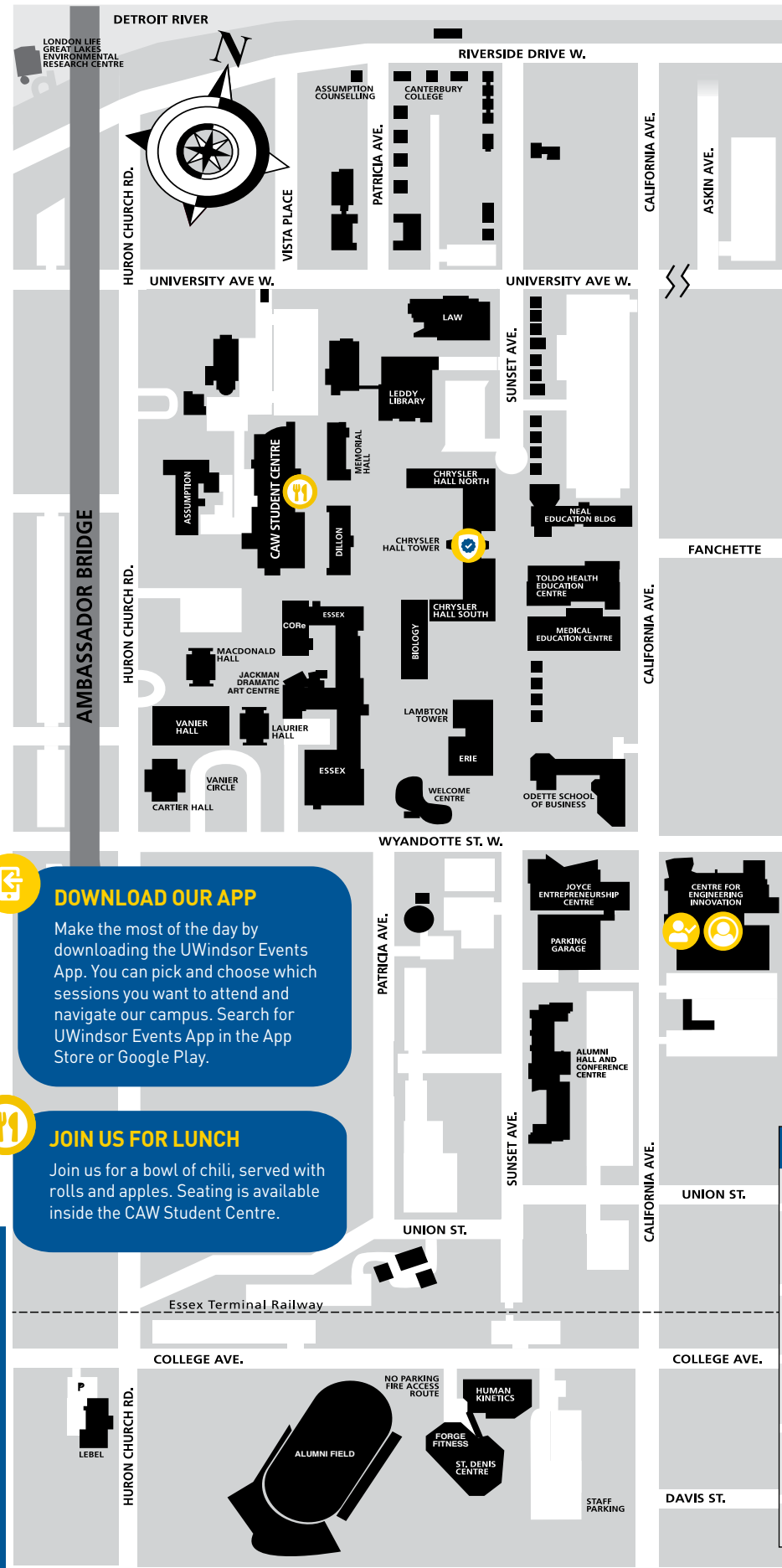


# UNIVERSITY OF WINDSOR CAMPUS MAP

Follow the UWindsor shields to the Registrar's Office in Chrysler Hall Tower.

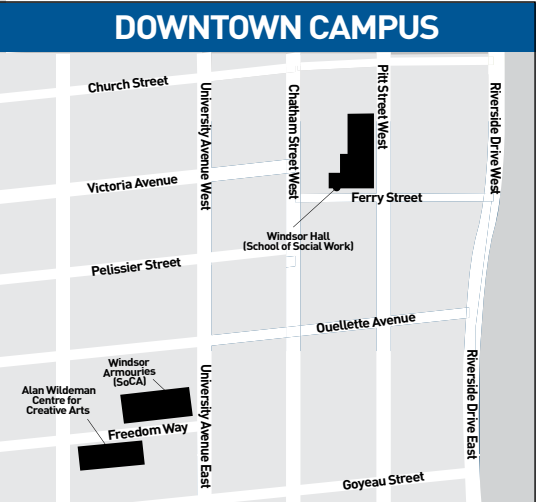
**PARENTS' CAFÉ**
